

REMOTE LEARNING ADDENDUM TO THE STUDENT/PARENT HANDBOOK

In order to comply with guidelines set forth by the Center for Disease Control, the State of California, and the County of Santa Clara, with regards to COVID-19, the following updates have been made to the Student/Parent Handbook:

School Closure

Kehillah Jewish High School will begin the 2020-2021 school year in a remote setting. In-person learning will resume at a future date. The Kehillah Pandemic Task Force will determine when it is safe to open, taking into consideration many factors including the spread of the virus in the greater community, teacher well-being, community support, and supply chain for PPE and cleaning materials.

Once in-person learning has resumed, if there is notification of a confirmed case while school is in session, school will close immediately for the duration of the week. If multiple community members are sent home with symptoms of COVID-19, the school will need to close due to the closure of classroom/common spaces on campus to continue in-person learning. Any lost learning time due to a school closure will be compensated for with a Flex day and/or special schedule.

Student Movement between Kehillah and the OFJCC

Kehillah considers the Oshman Family JCC as part of our campus and highly values this relationship. We have continued student memberships for this academic year but access to the JCC is determined by the JCC's COVID-19 policies. At the time of the writing of this document, students are welcome to use the JCC's outdoor facilities with an appointment.

Illness & Extended Absence

Students who are in self-isolation for COVID-19-related illnesses are not required to attend remote classes if they are not feeling well enough to do so. A reentry plan will be created for students when they are able to join classes again. Students with a confirmed case, but otherwise feeling well enough, are encouraged to participate in distance learning.

Technology Policy

- Students need a device that is able to download software- Macbooks, PCs, and tablets are okay. Chromebooks will not.
- Only teachers can record class sessions and disseminate class recordings
- Keep personally identifiable information like last name, date of birth, etc private. Do not use last names on Zoom screen.
- Do not share Zoom codes with persons outside of Kehillah
- Do not enter Zoom rooms without permission
- Students may not hold official school activities (on campus or in remote) without Kehillah faculty/staff present
