OUR STORY

Kehillah Jewish High School is distinguished by an exceptional academic program in a supportive environment. At Kehillah, students embark on a journey of self-discovery guided by a community of passionate educators. They graduate with the knowledge, values, and community that enable them to create extraordinary futures.

BACKGROUND AND LOCATION

Kehillah Jewish High School is an independent Jewish high school that welcomes a diversity of students from both public and private schools. Located in the heart of Silicon Valley, our Palo Alto location allows us to welcome students from as far north as Burlingame, as far south as

Morgan Hill, and as far east as Pleasant Hill. Our campus offers state-of-the-art physics, chemistry, and biology labs, a laboratory for engineering arts, music and art studios, a "black-box" theatre, and an exceptional gym and athletic facility. Average classroom size is 12 students. Kehillah is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges and by the California Association of Independent Schools.

STUDENT LIFE

Kehillah provides many leadership opportunities and a robust program of extra-curricular sports and activities.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES:

EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING:

Kehillah's experiential learning program is central to the student experience. They include weekly Reflective Practice, Beit Midrash,

Kabbalat Shabbat (entirely student-led), Advisory, Grade Level Seminars, and Annual Class Trips, including the highlight of the Kehillah experience: the 11th grade trip to Israel.

CURRICULUM

Kehillah operates on a block system. Students engage in a challenging array of core courses in English, History/Social Studies, Math, Science, Language, and Jewish Studies (see graduation requirements below). Students in grades 9-11 enroll in at least 7 courses (with one free block). At least 6 courses (and two free blocks) are required for students in grade 12.

JEWISH STUDIES AT KEHILLAH:

Each semester, students are required to choose one elective from our three areas of concentration: "Thought and Tradition," "Life and Culture," and "History and Identity," or our Text-based courses that focus on the exploration of canonical texts from biblical and rabbinic literature and involve the study of both Hebrew and

Aramaic. All courses offered by the Jewish Studies department are UC approved, draw upon 3,000 years of Jewish tradition, and prepare student to become better world citizens.

NOTES ON THE CURRICULUM:

- **Honors and AP Enrollment:** Students enroll in Honors and AP courses through a process of individual course counseling and academic departmental recommendations.
- **Implications of the Jewish Studies (JS) Requirement:** JS courses are part of the core curriculum at Kehillah and are required every semester. This means that Kehillah students are required to enroll in 7 core courses each year through 11th grade. As a result, students often make curricular choices for the junior year that take this additional course requirement into account. This might include not selecting an AP course in the 11th grade in order to accommodate the additional JS core requirement.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

9th – 11th graders must take at least 7 courses;

GRADING SYSTEM AND CLASS RANK

- Grade point average (GPA) is calculated on the basis of all courses taken at Kehillah, except Physical Education and Directed Studies. **Courses taken outside of Kehillah are not included in the cumulative GPA.**
- GPA is cumulative. Honors and Advanced Placement courses receive a weight of +1.
- Consistent with Kehillah's commitment to a supportive academic environment that values all of our students, Kehillah does not rank students nor award academic distinctions.

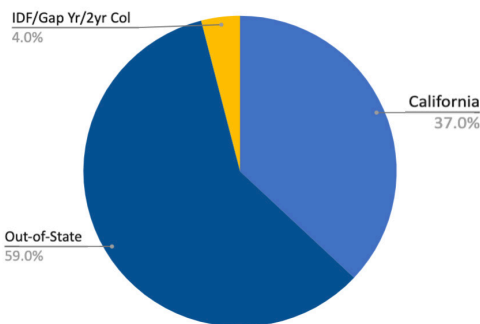

COVID-19 IMPACTS ON KEHILLAH

SCHOOL OPERATIONS

- School operated remotely for one full year (March 2020-March, 2021).
- School operated on a hybrid basis between March 8, 2021- June, 2021.
- Kehillah ran synchronous classes four days per week, with Wednesdays preserved for experiential education, additional 30-minute AP class meetings, office hours, and a much-needed break from Zoom-fatigue.
- After March 8, 2021, students were given the option to return to the building for in-person classes. About 75% returned.
- Because of the particular challenges that Covid-19 presented, some students were approved to take classes on a pass/fail basis during the 2020 spring semester. A passing grade indicates a grade of 70% or above.
- School became fully operational for in-person classes beginning August, 2021 with no option available for remote learning.

STUDENT LIFE

- No athletics teams met or competed between March, 2020 - March, 2021.
- A limited number of school clubs met virtually.
- Spring Athletics and many school clubs resumed in March, 2021; All normal school activities and athletics teams resumed beginning August, 2021.

STANDARDIZED TESTING

- SAT School-day testing and ACT School-day testing was administered at Kehillah in October, 2021 as an option for Kehillah seniors due to ongoing test cancellations in the Bay Area throughout Spring and Summer, 2021.
